Kia ora e te whānau,

School lunch changes

As a school we are incredibly disappointed and concerned about the changes occurring for our tamariki from next year in regards to school lunches. This lunch programme is such an asset for our school, students and community. Ngāti Kahungunu make delicious, nutritious and hearty food for ALL of our students and we have seen an increase in attendance and student engagement in learning since this has occurred.

I know the news has lots of people commenting about parents needing to just step up and feed their children. At South School our families work hard to provide kai for their children- but it comes at a real cost. Our families prioritise lunches for their children but sometimes this comes with sacrifice - adults not eating properly or a bill may not be paid to make this happen. All our families love their children and work incredibly hard to provide for them. School lunches being provided has removed that stress off whānau in a time where money is tight.

What are the lunch changes from next year?

Next year our year 0-6 students (Te Kākano and Te Tipu) will continue to get their meals and fruit as normal until the end of 2026. From next year our year 7 and 8 students (Te Puāwai) will be funded at less than half of their current funding (and almost half of what the rest of our students will receive) at \$3 a day. They will no longer be allowed to be fed by Ngāti Kahungunu and instead the school will be required to order kai for them through an on-line portal.

The food that will be available has been described as "long shelf life food". It has been compared to what the food Kids Can currently offer - muesli bars, fruit pottles and cans of beans. The options will be confirmed over the next 8 months but the nutrition requirements have been made much looser and the nutritionists that designed our current lunches have been made redundant. There is no funding for cooks to make food or for the administration of the ordering, managing and delivering of this packaged kai to students. Schools can fund this through their current operations grants (which is where we pay our teacher aides, support staff, power, purchase learning resources etc from). This grant will not be increased to cover the cost so we would need to reduce spending in another areas to cover this cost.

At Dannevirke South School we believe this is unfair to our students as we will have 3/4 of our school eating amazing nutritious food and our seniors will be eating out of packets. We are also concerned about the lack of funding to help manage and deliver the new system for seniors. We will not withdraw from the programme as we believe it is essential for our tamariki and community but we will be advocating for this change to be reconsidered.

Whānau Week next week

Week 5 every term is a time we call Whānau Week. We hold no meetings this week and ask all teachers to be out of school by 3.30pm. This is a week for teachers to go home early, connect with whānau and do things that "fill their bucket". We want to acknowledge the complex job that is teaching and the many extra hours our staff do. We are lucky to have such supportive and dedicated teachers here and this week is a small way that we help to support their well-being. Thank you for your support with this.

Staff Only Day NEXT Friday 31st May

Just a reminder that school will be closed next Friday (31st May) for a staff only day – this is a compulsory Ministry of Education Professional learning day. Staff will not be on site as we will be working at another school.

WHAT HAS TE PUAWAI BEEN LEARNING?

In Te Puawai we have been learning about statistics. We have used a collection of data and have learned about three different averages which are mean, median and mode. To work out the mean average we used the total amount of the numbers and divided this by how many numbers are in the data set. To work out median we put the data in number order, from smallest to largest, to figure out the middle number in the data set - if there are two
