They are researching what schools can do to increase their regular attendance and we were one of the schools they identified across NZ who has had a big increase! They are coming to talk to us, our tamariki and some families about how we have increased this. We are really proud to be one of the 16 schools who have made a positive impact on regular attendance. We are hoping to have an even bigger increase this year as poor attendance has such a big impact on the future for our children. Did you know that only 50 % of 25 year olds who had poor attendance earn either a salary or wage?

School Lunches

There has been lots of information in the media about the new school lunches provided by the School lunches collective. These lunches are **NOT** the lunches we receive. We were lucky enough to be part of the lwi scheme which differs from the Lunch Collective. This means that we get to carry on with Ngāti Kahungunu who operate out of a kitchen in the back of Sugar and Salt cafe. We have fresh and yummy food with ingredients sourced in our area, made by people from our community. We have been affected by the reduction in funding for each meal though so the sizes of our meals have decreased and we now only get fruit once a week. Even with these changes we are so appreciative of having food that is yummy, nutritious and fresh.


